Whenever it was our son Jason's turn all he would say is "Jesus wept". I would look at him and I would finish saying Grace because I wanted our kids to understand we do this not as a duty but to actually thank God for what he has provided. During dinner there was always a lot of good conversation except when it came to Jason. He rarely said anything and usually left the table shortly after finishing his meal. As time moved on Jason was getting more and more secretive and distant. He was removed from his High School Football team because he was failing academically. Then the fights at school began. When we tried talking to Jason about what was going on he would simply say we were making a big deal about nothing. Then one day while doing laundry Mary found a knife in the pocket of his jeans. When she confronted him he claimed it wasn't his and someone must have put it there to get him in trouble. A few weeks later I smelled an odor I hadn't experiences since I was a teenager. It was the smell of cigarettes and it was coming from Jason's room. I entered his room and asked why do I smell cigarette smoke? He had sprayed what seemed like a can of deodorizer but don't believe the commercials because it doesn't work. Mary and I prayed often for the well-being of our children and things were getting very serious with Jason. It all came to a head when we got a call that Jason had been arrested for robbery. He was convicted and went away for six years. Although he was released two years ago this was the first time he has been home. Prior to dinner we sat in the garage and talked. I asked him why he stayed away so long after his release. He said he knew he had messed up and was too ashamed to come home. When he played ball he could hear me shouting in the stands "that's my Son". After being removed from the football team in High School he thought I was no longer proud of him. He then started hanging out with the wrong crowd because although he knew they were getting him into trouble, they seemed to care about him. He felt he had done so many bad things that there was no way the family will ever forgive him so he stayed away. One day while riding the Bus to work he saw a billboard which said... To the Lord our God belong mercy and forgiveness, though we have rebelled against Him. <Daniel 9:9> Today he came home to ask his Family to forgive him. At the dinner table Jason Blessed the meal and we had that family discussion which was long overdue. Kathy and Karen gave their big brother a hug and told him how much they missed him. At the end of the evening as Mary and I said goodnight, I gave Jason a hug and told him I loved him. Then being totally facetious I winked at Mary and said "maybe your Mother loves you too". That brought a smile to Jason's face which we haven't seen in years. God is good.

A twelve-course curriculum has been prepared which will equal one full year of studies at Texas Bible College. Students earn Texas Bible College credit hours just as if they were enrolled at the campus in Lufkin. Classes convene one night per week for a period of eleven weeks in the Spring and Fall. They normally begin at 7:00 p.m. and end by 10:00 p.m. Two courses are taught each night with approximately one hour and twenty minutes devoted to each with a break in between.
